Ifold cubs runs every Thursday between 6:30pm-8pm; the age group is between 8 - 10 1/2. Currently the 'pack' is 26 strong (full!). The cub leaders are Andy Fenney and Stuart Haines with Michael Williams, Alice Dore and Jake Saunders as assistant leaders.

The 'pack' play games, light fires, go on camps and work towards badges such as first aid, wood work and cooking...cubs provides a broad spectrum of life skills whilst having lots of fun!

## Ifold & Plaistow Scout and Guide Group

1st Ifold Scout Group started in the 1960's as a Cub Pack, originally meeting in Kelsey hall. After a couple of year's the Scout Troop was started. In 1971 the group purchased a redundant barracks building from the Broadbridge Heath Army Camp and dismantled it for transfer to Ifold. Local farmer, Tom Micklam provided a plot of land in Foxbridge lane and the building was re-assembled and opened in 1975. Since then the 1st Ifold Scout group has expanded and joined with 1st Ifold Brownies and Plaistow Guides to form the Ifold & Plaistow Scout and Guide Group. A Beaver Colony started in 1992 and Venture Units (age 16+) and more recently Explorer Units (age 14-18) have used the building.

In the last 10 years with the support of the Executive Committee and parents, the building has been refurbished and expanded with a large equipment store, additional meeting room, new toilets and a magnificent kitchen. It is now one of the best and certainly most characterful Scout and Guide HQs in the district.
