Assessment: This site could come forward for a limited amount of development. The site is environmentally sensitive and needs a careful design scheme. Development must protect the character and appearance of the Grade II listed houses (Todhurst, Back Lane Cottage, Red Hatch), village and conservation area. It recommended to develop only part of the site and to retain the rest as public green space (to be kept naturalized). Attention is drawn to the sewage pumping station (Nell Ball Plaistow Waste Pumping Station site reference no.: 101288) located at the entrance to the site from Ashfield with a green-box housed electricity sub-station attached (please note: existing maps incorrectly indicate this only as an 'El Sub Stn'). It is possible a buffer is required around the station. Attention is drawn to the presence of high / low voltage power supply lines within the site and the possibility that these will need to be re-routed in order to accommodate access to the proposed development.

Capacity: Capacity a maximum of 11 dwellings in order to mitigate potential harm.

Design Requirements: Protect Grade II listed houses, conservation area, bridleway and ancient woodland from impact. Retain naturalised vegetation to undeveloped areas and reinforce with additional planting. One and two storey housing, mixed house types to meet housing need. Remove permitted development rights for extensions and loft conversions to maintain the rural character and low impact. Style to conform to the village vernacular and conservation area. For any development, a Condition is essential that improvements would be required to car-parking through Nell Ball to assist the access.
