**THE TALE OF PETER RABBIT by Beatrix Potter**
- 6 Who, with her daughters, founded the Women’s Social and Political Union? (first name and surname required)  
**EMMELINE (Emily) PANKHURST**
- 7 What was the 3-word motto of the Women’s Social and Political Union?
